having just emerged from a prolonged civil war and faced with the urgent tasks of establishing political stability and reinvigorating an economy in tatters the transitional government of ethiopia 1991 1995 had to set a new direction for the economic reconstruction and social rehabilitation of the warn torn and poverty ridden country during the transitional period a spate of new policies and strategies defining the development priorities goals and implementation instruments of the new regime led by the eprdf was introduced this work is a synthesis of various sectoral policies and an attempt to trace the genesis of the policies highlight the continuities significant departures and other salient features each of the reviews in this digest briefly analyses the critical elements of the policies identifies major gaps in the conceptualisation of the policy as well as the achievements registered and the challenges encountered in its implementation the authors also try to identify the outstanding issues to be addressed by policymakers and suggest remedies the policy reviews have been grouped into three parts and presented under social economic and governance sectors

investing to promote agricultural growth and poverty reduction is a central pillar of the world bank's current rural strategy reaching the rural poor 2003 this sourcebook addresses how to implement the rural strategy by sharing information on investment options and identifying innovative approaches that will aid the design of future lending programs for agriculture it provides generic good practices and many examples that demonstrate investment in agriculture can provide rewarding and sustainable returns to development efforts it is divided into eleven self contained modules each module contains three different types of subunits that can also be stand alone documents i module overview ii agricultural investment notes iii innovative activity profiles the stand alone nature of the subunits allows flexibility and adaptability of the material selected readings and web links are also provided for readers who seek more in depth

information the sourcebook draws on a wide range of experiences from donor agencies governments institutions and other groups active in agricultural development it is an invaluable reference tool for policy makers professionals academics and students and anyone with an interest in agricultural investments

the aim of nigerias extension reform and transformation agenda through its new national extension policy nep is to put in place a legislated pluralistic farmer responsive and market oriented extension system the reformed extension system aims at an assured and regular source of funding and a well trained and motivated staff effectively catering for a variety of actors along targeted value chains it also aims at effective integration of the complex innovation processes in the agricultural and food system transformation in nigeria implementation of the nep at the state level remains a major challenge this paper documents issues challenges constraints and potential solutions and opportunities in implementing nep at the state level using niger state as a case study we use a qualitative method in the context of inclusive consultative process with a focus on the multi stakeholder participatory model we found that strengthening actors capacities for innovation by considering the complexity of agricultural innovation system is very critical to effective and successful implementation of national agricultural policies in niger state we confirm from our study that networking partnership facilitation and collaboration functions are crucial cross cutting measures across the agricultural innovation system for operative and systematic implementation of the nep in niger state based on our findings in niger state even if we make effort to draw generic lessons for nigeria the case studies show that understanding the dynamics of efficiently and productively implementing the national extension policy remain case specific and no silver bullet can be provided to support agricultural innovation system due to the complex federal governance system in nigeria therefore a state level or case specific is highly recommended for operational implementation process in nigeria

investing in farmers or agriculture human capital is crucial to addressing challenges in our agri food systems a global study carried out by the fao investment centre and the international food policy research institute with support from the cgiar research programme on policies institutions and markets and the fao research and extension unit looks at agriculture human capital investments from trends to promising initiatives one of the nine featured case studies is the twigire muhinzi national extension system in rwanda twigire muhinzi is the government's homegrown decentralized and farmer oriented national system based on two complementary types of farmer to farmer extension approaches farmer promoters and farmer field schools the model showcases how an extension approach can improve farmer skills knowledge and empowerment and thus lead to enhanced adoption of relevant technologies and practices in rwanda mainstreaming the farmer field school approach into the national extension system along with financial support from public private partnerships contributed to its scaling

agricultural extension plays a number of important roles in the growth and transformation of the agricultural sector including improving agricultural productivity and food security and reducing hunger and malnutrition extension programs and interventions that will achieve significant impacts in terms of behavior and practice changes as well as agricultural productivity increase will succeed as a result of suitable policy formulation and an effective implementation process ultimately agricultural extension reform requires policy vision and determination and a state level strategy that can be implemented this paper documents issues challenges constraints and potential solutions and opportunities in implementing the national extension policy nep at the state level in nigeria using cross river state as a case study we use both quantitative and qualitative methods in the form of descriptive statistical analysis and an inclusive consultative process with a focus on the multistakeholder participatory model respectively the descriptive results show that generally there is low access to agricultural extension service across commodities and their respective values chains in cross river state we also document interesting insights from the multistakeholder consultative process we find that collaboration and partnership between private and public extension service providers is key to developing a sustainable extension advisory and support service in cross river state we also found that coordination and standardization of the activities of the extension service providers is a way to avoid pollution of the agricultural innovation system in the state funding of extension services is another important factor affecting the effective implementation of the nep we therefore suggest that agricultural extension services can be funded through decentralization involvement of farmers associations and nongovernmental organizations contracting out of extension services public private partnerships privatization and embedding advisory services in other types of contracts the results of this study further validate our approach of using multistakeholder engagement at the state level as an effective and insightful method of implementing the nep at the state level
